# A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Commerce to establish a task force regarding shark depredation, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### **3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supporting the Health  
5 of Aquatic systems through Research Knowledge and En-  
6 hanced Dialogue Act” or the “SHARKED Act”.

## **7 SEC. 2. SHARK DEPREDATION TASK FORCE AND RESEARCH**

### **8 PROJECTS**

9 (a) SHABK DEPREDATION TASK FORCE —

1                         (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Commerce  
2 shall establish a task force (referred to in this sub-  
3 section as the “task force”) to identify and address  
4 critical needs with respect to shark depredation.

5                         (2) MEMBERSHIP.—The Secretary of Com-  
6 mercial shall appoint individuals to the task force, in-  
7 cluding—

8                             (A) 1 representative from—

9                                 (i) each Regional Fishery Manage-  
10 ment Council established under section  
11 302(a)(1) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fish-  
12 ery Conservation and Management Act (16  
13 U.S.C. 1852(a)(1));

14                                 (ii) each Marine Fisheries Commis-  
15 sion, as such term is defined in section 3  
16 of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Con-  
17 servation and Management Act (16 U.S.C.  
18 1802);

19                                 (iii) the fish and wildlife agency of a  
20 coastal State from each Regional Fishery  
21 Management Council established under  
22 section 302(a)(1) of the Magnuson-Stevens  
23 Fishery Conservation and Management Act  
24 (16 U.S.C. 1852(a)(1)); and

(iv) the National Marine Fisheries Service;

(B) an individual with expertise in the management of highly migratory species; and

(C) a researcher with expertise in shark management and behavior.

(A) develop ways to improve coordination and communication across the fisheries management community to address shark depredation;

12 (B) identify research priorities and funding  
13 opportunities for such priorities, including—

14 (i) identifying shark species involved  
15 in interactions;

(ii) shark stock assessments;

(iv) how angler behavior and fishery regulatory frameworks may influence shark interactions; and

23 (v) techniques and strategies to re-  
24 duce harmful interactions between sharks

1                   and humans, including the development  
2                   and use of non-lethal deterrents;

3                   (C) develop recommended management  
4                   strategies to address shark depredation; and

5                   (D) coordinate the development and dis-  
6                   tribution of educational materials to help the  
7                   fishing community minimize shark interactions.

8                   (4) REPORT.—Not later than 2 years after the  
9                   date of the enactment of this section, and every 2  
10                  years thereafter until the termination of the task  
11                  force in accordance with paragraph (5), the task  
12                  force shall submit to Congress a report regarding  
13                  the findings of the task force.

14                  (5) SUNSET.—The task force shall terminate  
15                  not later than 7 years after the date on which the  
16                  Secretary of Commerce establishes the task force.

17                  (6) COASTAL STATE DEFINED.—In this sub-  
18                  section, the term “coastal State”—

19                   (A) means a State of the United States in,  
20                   or bordering on, the Atlantic Ocean, Pacific  
21                   Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, or Long  
22                   Island Sound; and

23                   (B) includes Puerto Rico, the Virgin Is-  
24                   lands of the United States, Guam, the Com-

1 monwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands,  
2 and American Samoa.

3 (b) SHARK DEPREDATION RESEARCH PROJECTS.—  
4 Section 318(c) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Con-  
5 servation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1867(c)) is  
6 amended by adding at the end the following:

7 “(6) Projects to better understand shark depre-  
8 dation, including identifying what causes increases  
9 in shark depredation and determining how to best  
10 address shark depredation.”.
