George B. Taylor, Jr. is Deputy General Counsel for Oglethorpe Power Corporation, headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. Since joining the Corporation in 1976, he has also worked as Assistant Planning Engineer; Section Manager, Power Supply Planning; Section Manager, Power Contracts; Department Manager, Power Contracts; Manager, Regulatory Compliance; Senior Negotiator; Legal Advisor to the CEO; Vice President; and Senior Vice President, Strategic Initiatives. In these positions, Mr. Taylor has performed transmission and power supply system planning, negotiated transmission, power supply and power plant acquisition agreements, designed wholesale power rates, managed regulatory interfaces and the relationship with the Southeastern Power Administration, and managed various corporate restructuring and acquisition projects.

Mr. Taylor has represented Oglethorpe Power on the board of the Southeastern Federal Power Customers for over 25 years, and has represented the Southeast on NRECA's National Preference Customer Committee for over 20 years.
