1 **Subtitle B—Resilient Federal**
2 **Forests and Wildfire Prevention**

3 **SEC. 70201. IN GENERAL.**

4 (a) PROTECTING COMMUNITIES AND ECOSYSTEMS
5 FROM WILDFIRE AND CREATING RESILIENT FORESTS AT
6 THE FOREST SERVICE.—In addition to amounts otherwise
7 available, there is appropriated to the Forest Service for
8 fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not
9 otherwise appropriated, \$2,775,750,000, to remain avail-
10 able until September 30, 2031, except that no amounts
11 may be expended after September 30, 2031, to reduce
12 wildfire risk on landscapes and communities through—

13 (1) thinning, including mechanical thinning;

14 (2) prescribed burning;

15 (3) timber harvesting;

16 (4) creating new markets for hazardous fuels
17 removed from National Forest System lands;

18 (5) the creation of fuel and fire breaks;

19 (6) improved fire risk mapping, data collec-
20 tion and coordination, and management;

1 (7) removal of hazard trees or salvage timber
2 for purposes of the protection of public health or
3 safety, water supply, or public infrastructure; or

4 (8) any combination of purposes described in
5 paragraphs (1) through (7).

6 (b) PROTECTING COMMUNITIES AND ECOSYSTEMS
7 FROM WILDFIRE AND CREATING RESILIENT FORESTS AT
8 THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT.—In addition to
9 amounts otherwise available, there is appropriated to the
10 Bureau of Land Management for fiscal year 2022, out of
11 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
12 \$1,665,450,000, to remain available until September 30,
13 2031, except that no amounts may be expended after Sep-
14 tember 30, 2031, to reduce wildfire risk on landscapes and
15 communities through—

16 (1) thinning, including mechanical thinning;

17 (2) prescribed burning;

18 (3) timber harvesting;

19 (4) creating new markets for hazardous fuels;

20 (5) the creation of fuel and fire breaks;

21 (6) improved firehazard risk mapping, data collec-
22 tion and coordination, and management;

23 (7) removal of hazard trees or salvage timber
24 for purposes of the protection of public health or
25 safety, water supply, or public infrastructure; or

1 (8) any combination of purposes described in
2 paragraphs (1) through (7).

3 (c) TRIBAL WILDFIRE PREVENTION.—In addition to
4 amounts otherwise available, there is appropriated to the
5 Bureau of Indian Affairs for fiscal year 2022, out of any
6 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
7 \$1,110,300,000, except that no amounts may be expended
8 after September 30, 2031, to reduce wildfire risk on land-
9 scapes and communities through—

10 (1) thinning, including mechanical thinning;

11 (2) prescribed burning;

12 (3) timber harvesting;

13 (4) creating new markets for hazardous fuels;

14 (5) the creation of fuel and fire breaks;

15 (6) improved firehazard risk mapping, data collec-
16 tion and coordination, and management;

17 (7) removal of hazard trees or salvage timber
18 for purposes of the protection of public health or
19 safety, water supply, or public infrastructure; or

20 (8) any combination of purposes described in
