### **Summary of Background and Experience:**

Glen H. Spain has been involved with a variety of U.S. West Coast and national environmental and natural resource issues, including many ocean protection issues, since 1968. Since 1988 he has served as a permanent Professional Staff member with the Pacific Coast Federation of Fishermen's Associations (PCFFA), the U.S. west coast's largest organization of commercial fishing families, as well as its General Legal Counsel. Since 1992 he has also served as the Northwest Regional Director for PCFFA as well as for its sister organization, the Institute for Fisheries Resources (IFR). IFR funds and manages PCFFA's many research and resource conservation initiatives, from their joint Eugene, OR and San Francisco, CA offices. Mr. Spain testifies and lectures widely on behalf of PCFFA and IFR on sustainable ocean resource development, including on both anadromous and marine resource species protection policies and issues, throughout the Pacific Northwest and elsewhere.
