- (2) each applicable Indian Tribe or Native Hawaiian organization with respect to any projects carried out with funds reserved for use in Tribal, Alaska Native, or Native Hawaiian communities under this section; and
- (3) the applicable Governor of a State and applicable county commissioners when carrying out projects under this section.
- (i) ACCOUNTABILITY.—No later than 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Secretary of the Interior shall submit a report to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives describing the work of each of the Civilian Corps, including—
  - (1) the total number of conservation projects completed and the cost of each project;
  - (2) a description of each conservation project currently in progress including—
    - (A) the location of the project;
    - (B) the number of civilian corps members employed by the project; and
    - (C) the total cost of the project; and
  - (3) for each contract, grant, or cooperative agreement—
    - (A) the number of bids received;
